STATEMENT OF

H. E. THE MINISTER OF NATIONAL ECONOMY AND SUPERVISOR OF MINISTRY OF FINANCE, DEPUTY CHAIRMAN FOR FINANCIAL AFFAIRS AND ENERGY RESOURCES COUNCIL ON THE STATE'S GENERAL BUDGET FOR THE YEAR 2007

It is my pleasure to meet with you today on the occasion of the issuance of the Royal Decree No (1/2007) ratifying the State's General Budget (SGB) for the fiscal year 2007 which is the second year of the Seventh Five-Year Development Plan (2006-2010) and review with you the main economic indicators of the national economy's performance for 2006 and also to shed light on the major features of the (SGB) for 2007.

First: The International economy and the international oil prices:

During 2006 the global economy has been characterized by a strong performance and is expected to achieve a growth rate of (5.1%) according to the forecast of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) .This is due to the decline of the energy prices on the one hand and the strong demand on the other hand .

However , in 2007 the growth rate of the international economy is expected to decrease to (4.9%) .Such decline is attributable to the increasing current account deficit in USA and the expected rise of the energy prices, in addition to the increase in the cost of borrowing. However the growth rate of the international groups are expected to vary due to the decline in growth rate of the advanced countries to about (2.5%) due to the impact of the US economy's performance. Yet some countries, like China and India are expected to continue recording high growth rates ranging between 9 and 10% .

The International markets forecasts indicate that oil prices will remain stable in 2007 at their current levels .The forecasts are based on the assumption of stable geopolitical conditions and moderate weather as well as the assumption that OPEC intervenes to ensure balance between supply and demand .

Second : Main features of the national economy's performance in 2006 :

* Preliminary estimates of GDP indicate that the national economy will achieve a growth rate of (16.8%) continuing its characteristic increasing growth in the recent years .Such performance is due on one hand to the increase in oil prices and on the other hand to the appropriate climate that is conducive to growth which was facilitated by the economic and monetary policies followed by the government .In addition, it was due to the noticeable expansion in the production capacities of the LNG industry, the petrochemical industries, the strong local demand together with the improvement in the non-oil exports performance .

st One of the positive features of the national economy's performance in 2006 is that all of the main economic activities contributed to this growth .The value added of the oil activities, in spite of the fall in oil production by (5%) compared to 2005, will grow by (17.9%) as result of the increase in the oil prices and increase in the demand for natural gas.

However, the non-oil activities are expected to grow by (15.6%) which is strengthened by the actual growth rate in both LNG industry and tourism sector by (60.7%) and (22.4%) respectively .

- * Regarding the foreign trade, the expectations indicate an increase of the gross proceeds of exports in 2006 by (15.4%) compared with 2005. The oil exports are expected to grow by (8.2%) and the non-oil exports of Omani origin are expected to increase by (11.4%) by virtue of the increase in the exported quantities of LNG and its high prices which are linked with the oil prices in addition to commencing the export of fertilizers. The proceeds from re-export operations are expected to increase by (21.6%).
- * The imports are expected to increase in 2006 compared to 2005, by (15.5%) as a result of the increase in the commodity prices in the international markets and the drop in the exchange rate of the US\$ versus the other foreign currencies .This will result in increasing the surplus of the balance of trade in 2006 by (15.4%)compared with 2005.
- * Regarding Muscat securities market the trading volume during 2006 reached about R.O (1.1) billion representing (8%) of the Sultanate's GDP .The market value of securities listed in the market , at the end of the year , totaled R.O (5.9) billion compared with R.O(6.2) billion in 2005 .The positive performance of the national economy in 2006 was reflected positively on the performance of the market as its general indicator increased by (14%) .

The fiscal and monetary Policies , provisions and laws regulating the capital market have a positive impact on its performance and contributed effectively towards avoiding the obstacles facing the neighbouring countries markets .

- * In continuation to the good performance of the national economy during 2006, it is expected that it continues its growth rate at the level of all sectors and activities thereof particularly the non-oil activities which are expected to achieve a growth by (12.5%).
- $\boldsymbol{*}$ In respect of the development programme of the civil ministries approved under the Seventh Five-Year Development Plan which is considered as the main driver of the Plan and its implementation tool, the original total appropriations thereof amounted to R.O(3016) million . During 2006 a number of projects were added in response to Royal Directives which were issued during the annual Royal Tours and which instructed finding the urgent needs of citizens in wilayats and regions and work towards satisfying same , together with many of the infrastructure projects. The total of these additions reached R.O (612) million , thus the appropriations for the development programme increased by (20.3%) to reach R.O (3628.3) million . Of this R.O (364.1) million are the cost of the new projects which are planned to be implemented during this year .

Following is a summary of these additions per sector :-

First: Roads sector by R.O (225) million:

Includes the following projects:

- a) Dualization of Amrat Quraiat road in the amount of R.O (66) million.
- b) Dualization of Salalah Thumreit road in the amount of R.O (48) million .
- c) Dualization of Sohar Al Buraimi road (Wadi Al-Jizi road) in the amount of R.O (46) million.
- d) Construction of Seeb international airport intersection in the amount of R.O (6) million.
- e) Interior roads projects in the different regions in the amount of R.O (75) million .

Second: Ports sector by R.O (148) million:

Includes the following projects:

- a) Construction of docks for the third phase of Sohar industrial port in the amount of R.O(66) million .
- b) Purchasing five ferry vessels for R.O (46) million .Two for north of the Sultanate, two for the south of the Sultanate and one for Musiera island.

Third: Housing sector by R.O (43) million:

It includes the following projects:

- Building of (2703) new housing units for citizens in the different regions of the Sultanate as follows:
 - □ Construction of (1410) new housing units in a number of Wilayats in the amount of R.O(21) million.
 - ☐ Enhancing the construction costs of 1293 existing housing units in order to face the increase in cost between the approved funds and the tenders results in the amount of R.O(6) million .

In addition to this, H.M the Sultan ordered the building of (1000) housing units in the different Wilayats of the Sultanate under the housing assistance progarmme provided by the Ministry of Housing, Electricity and Water in addition to that approved in the Plan. Coordination is currently underway regarding these units whereas the distribution thereof is expected to start at the beginning of this year 2007.

Forth: Airports sector by R.O (41) million:

Includes the following projects:

- a) Filling up and leveling works for the new Seeb international airport grounds in the amount of R.O (13.5) million .
- b) Consultancy services for Seeb and Salalah airports in the amount of R.O (7.6) million .
- c) Consultancy studies for the construction of Ras Alhad and Al Duqum airports projects in the amount of R.O (5) million .

Fifth: Health sector by R.O (37) million:

It includes the following projects:

- a) The integrated unit project for heart diseases in Sultan Qaboos Salalah Hospital in the amount of R.O (11) million
- b) Al Buraimi poly-clinic project with CT scanning unit in the amount of R.O (3) million.
- c) Purchasing medical equipments in the amount of R.O (5) million.

During this year the construction of a psychiatric hospital will begin with capacity of (200) beds in the amount of R.O (20) million.

Sixth: Town planning and municipalities services by R.O (49) million

Includes the following projects:

- □ Lightening of a number of roads in the length of 200Km in Wilayats Al Buraimi and Muhda for R.O (2.8) million
- Strengthening the sewage networks for nine cities (first phase) against R.O (6.5) million
- Modernization of the cleaning vehicles and equipments of the Ministry of regional municipalities, environment and water resources, and Dhofar munic ipality for R.O (5) million

Seventh: Education sector by R.O (27) million:

Includes the following projects:

- Approving allocations for (70) annual scholarships to Oman medical college for batches four to eight in the amount of R.O (4.2) million.
- Enhancing the annual scholarships projects (partial and full) for the study of medicine, pharmacy and dentistry by R.O (4.5) million.
- Construction of class rooms and lecture theatres and establishing residential units for female students in Sultan Qaboos University against R.O (4.8) million.
 - □ Regarding the water sector , which is of priority during this Plan , the total amended appropriations amounted to R.O (363) million for implementation of a number of water projects in different regions of the Sultanate .
 - □ For the privatization programme , Sohar electricity and desalination station was established and is about to be completed whereas production is expected to start during the first quarter of this year . Also , tenders were invited for the construction of a desalination station in Sur and during the coming period the implementation agreement will be signed .The second phase of Barka electricity station is started and in this regard , the Rusayl electrical station was sold as part of the approved programme for privatization of the electricity stations owned by the government .In addition to this , a study is currently going on for establishing AL Dugum electricity station and another study for the strategy of restructuring the water and sewage sector in order to prepare

Regarding the selling of the government share in some companies and establishments, a study is currently underway for selling the Seeb hotel (near the airport).

Third: Public finance:

Before reviewing the main features of the general budget, I would like to mention briefly the actual expected results for the fiscal year 2006:

1) THE ACTUAL PERFORMANCE OF THE PUBLIC FINANCE IN 2006:

The state general budget for 2006 was approved as follows:	R.O million
- Total revenues	3587
- Total expenditure	4237
Deficit	650

The oil prices , for the budget purposes, were based upon the assumption of US\$(32). In spite of the additional projects approved during the year and the financial appropriations which were allocated to cover the different aspects of public expenditure , yet thanks to the stability witnessed by the international prices of oil at high levels , it is expected that the actual budget realizes a financial surplus after deficit coverage in the range of R.O (2400) million . This will be used for enhancing the government fiscal reserves and payment of some of the receivables of the retirement funds .

2) The main features of the general state budget for the year 2007 :

First: revenues:

The state's public revenues for fiscal year 2007 are estimated at about R.O (4490) million against R.O (3587) million for fiscal year 2006 , an increase by R.O (903) million or (25%) . The oil and gas revenues represent (79%) of the overall revenues whereas the current and capital revenues represent (21%) .

The oil revenues were estimated at an average price of US\$(40) per barrel and a daily production rate of (730) thousand barrels . Based on these assumptions , it is expected that the oil revenues reach about R.O (3015) million and its contribution to the overall revenues will be (67%) .The gas revenues will total about R.O (550) million which is (12%) of the overall revenues .The current and capital revenues are estimated at R.O (925) million , i.e. an increase by (37%) from that of 2006 budget.

Second : Expenditure :

The total public expenditure for fiscal year 2007 is estimated at about R.O (4890) million against R.O (4237) million for fiscal year 2006, an increase by R.O (653) million or (15%). This is to cover the following expenditure elements and components:

 The current expenditure of the civil ministries and units of the government is estimated at about R.O (1620) million, i.e. an increase by R.O (220) million or (16%) from last year estimates. The current expenditure represents (33%) of the overall public expenditure. The allocations cover the basic government services and operating expenditure of the government ministries and units, the growth in the education and health services and the operating expenses of the new projects.

It is worth to mention that the share of education and health sectors constitutes

(50%) of the gross current expenditure, as follows:

- a) The current allocations for the education sector amount to R.O (609) million i.e (38%) of the overall current expenditure of the civil ministries and an increase by R.O (84) million or (16%) over the approved budget of 2006 .This in addition to the development expenditure allocated for this sector estimated at about R.O (242) million .
- b) The health sector share amounts to R.O (199) million i.e (12%) of the overall current expenditure of the civil ministries. This means an increase by R.O (12) million or (6%) over the approved budget for the year 2006.
- c) R.O (30) million are allocated for social security to cover the cases under the social security umbrella which are (48926) cases.
- 2) The oil and gas production expenditures are estimated at R.O (1205) million representing (25%) of the gross public expenditure i.e an increase by (32%) over the approved budget of 2006.
- 3) The allocations for the development budget are estimated at R.O (500) million, an increase by (33%) compared with the approved budget for 2006. This is to cover the expenditure of the on- going as well as the new development projects listed in the different sectors under the Seventh Five-Year Plan (2006-2010).
- 4) Estimates of the subsidy allocated to the electricity sector amount to R.O(135) million , i.e. an increase by (7%) over the approved budget of 2006 .
- 5) The budget allocated to participations is estimated at R.O (102) million .This includes completion of the payment of the capital of Oman company for wastewater services and Salalah company for wastewater services in the amount of R.O (80) million . The remaining part is allocated for payment of the government share in the capital of some government companies and other companies in whose ownership the government participates .

Third : Deficit

Based on the approved estimates of revenues and expenditure of the public budget , the deficit for 2007 on the assumption of US\$(40) for oil is estimated at about R.O (400) million i.e (9%) of the revenues and (3%) of the GDP .It is lower than the deficit estimated for the last year 2006 budget by (38%) . Hence it is considered relatively low in relation to revenues or the GDP . It is presumed that this deficit will be covered by withdrawal from the contingencies reserve allocation .

Lastly , it is noteworthy that the growth rate in the volume of the general budget for this year which is (15%) reflects the keenness of the government to pursue encouragement and promotion of the national economy to continue its growth rate realized during the recent years and also to promote the comprehensive development in the various sectors as well as expansion of the government services to be reflected on the living standards of the citizens and realize prosperity for the society .

On this occasion we pray to Almighty Allah to grant our beloved country and devoted people everlasting prosperity in this bright era under the wise leadership of H.M Sultan Qaboos, Sultan of Oman. We also pray that this year shall be an year of peace, security and welfare to all Mankind.
